# Foundation will oversee funds from Grant County donors

**PLATTEVILLE, Wis.** — Ten charitable funds totaling more than \$700,000 have been transferred from the First National Bank in Platteville to the Community Foundation of Southern Wisconsin. The foundation will oversee the investments for the funds and grant awards according to the wishes of each fund's donor.

All 10 of the charitable funds originated from Grant County donors. They are:

- **Lyle K. Dobson Library Endowment Fund;** benefits the Platteville and Lancaster library foundations.

- **Robert A. & Marjorie M. Hartshorn Fund (I);** benefits the Alzheimer's Disease and Related Disorders Association.

- **Robert A. & Marjorie M. Hartshorn Fund (II);** benefits the American Macular Degeneration Foundation.

- **William Marsden Charitable Fund;** provides annual academic excellence awards for the Fennimore School District.

- **Margaret S. Keizer Charitable Fund;** supports organizations and institutions in the city of Platteville devoted to religious, charitable, scientific, literary, historical or educational purposes.

- **Harry C. Ziegert Scholarship Fund;** benefits Platteville High School graduates pursuing post-

high school education in the field of science.

- **Agnes "Tip" Ziegert Scholarship Fund;** benefits Platteville High School graduates pursuing post-high school education in the field of communication.

- **Platteville Consumers Cooperative Scholarship Fund;** benefits graduates of high schools in the association's market area including Belmont, Benton, Cuba City, Darlington, Iowa-Grant, Lancaster, Platteville, Shullsburg and Hazel Green. Students must pursue post-high school education in the field of agriculture or agribusiness.

- **Dr. Emily Farnum Scholarship Fund;** benefits Platteville High School graduates pursuing post-high school education in the field of English and University of Wisconsin-Platteville students, not graduates of Platteville High School, pursuing post-high school education in the field of English.

- **Elgie M. Ward Scholarship Fund;** benefits Platteville High School graduates pursuing post-high school education.

The awards from the Keizer Charitable Fund will be given through the Platteville Community Fund during its spring grant cycle. The awards from the Harry Ziegert, Agnes Ziegert, Emily Farnum and Elgie Ward scholarship funds will be advised by the PHS Scholarship Fund Advisory Board.
